# **Administration news**



#### **Spare Clothes**

At times students require a change of clothes while at school, particularly those in Junior Primary. Our school supply is limited so if your child has borrowed something please wash and return clothing to school asap. If items aren't returned there may be a time when parents are asked to deliver clothing to school if a change is needed. For students in Junior Primary, it can be a beneficial to pack a spare set of clothes in their bag, just incase items are required. Students usually feel more comfortable if they are wearing their own clothes. Thank you.

#### **Headlice**

There have been a number of reported cases of headlice within the school. We encourage parents to be diligent in checking their child/ren's and family member's hair regularly, particularly if there has been a known case in a classroom. A person is infectious while eggs or lice are alive.

A number of head lice treatments are available without prescription; family members may also need treatment. Re-treatment after 7 - 10 days is necessary because lice in unhatched eggs may not be killed by the first treatment. Using conditioner and a fine tooth comb once a week may help to detect infestations early and minimise spread from person-to-person.

Combs and brushes should be cleaned with detergent and hot water. Bed linen should be washed in hot water (60 degrees celsius or more), dried in a clothes dryer on the hot setting for at least 20 minutes. Parents are also asked to notify the school if head lice are discovered. Thank you for your support.

Richard gave us a class pet lion. We voted in our class meeting for his name to be Simba!








# Reception News

We played 'Save the Whale' on our laptops.









We played the bead string dice game that made us think about the parts of 10.

We drew Rainbow Facts in our books.








We made 'Parts of 10 Bridges' using blocks.

# Celebrating SAPSASA success Achievements in Cross Country





We are thrilled to share the outstanding achievements of Ava and Pippa at the SAPSASA State Cross Country Championships!

After qualifying for the Murraylands Cross Country Team by excelling in the trials at Unity College, Ava and Pippa competed at the Oakbank Racecourse on Thursday, June 6th.

Ava showcased her incredible stamina in the 11-year-olds category, competing against 168 participants and securing an impressive 30th place. She completed the 3-kilometre run in just 13 minutes and 31 seconds, surpassing her previous time by a remarkable 1 minute and 4 seconds.

Pippa also delivered an outstanding performance in the 10-year-olds category, racing against 105 competitors and finishing 60th. She ran the 2-kilometre course in 9 minutes, beating her previous record by an astonishing 1 minute and 30 seconds.

Congratulations to both athletes, Ava and Pippa, for their impressive results and for representing our community with such determination and spirit!






### DFS is scheduled to visit during:
